ORDINANCE NO. 7, SERIES 1994

AN ORDINANCE TO DESIGNATE THE EMERGENCY RESPONSE AUTHORITY FOR HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE OCCURRING WITHIN THE INCORPORATED LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF JAMESTOWN.

WHEREAS, the State of Colorado requires an ordinance to designate an emergency response authority for hazardous substance incidents occurring within the corporate limits of such town, city and county, pursuant to Colorado Revised Statutes 29-22-102 (3) (a), and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Jamestown wishes to comply with the Colorado Revised Statutes 29-22-102 (3) (a) hereby declares Ken Lenarcic, Town Trustee of the Town of Jamestown to be the Designated Authority for Hazardous Substance Incidents occurring within the incorporated limits of the Town of Jamestown, State of Colorado.

Section 1. Emergency Effective Date. The Board of Trustees herewith finds, determines, and declares that this ordinance is necessary to the immediate preservation of the public health and safety in order to timely provide procedures, standards, and requirements for hazardous substance incidents occurring within the city limits of the Town of Jamestown. This ordinance shall be effective upon adoption and approval by the Mayor.

Section 2. Repeal. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Town of Jamestown, Colorado in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, and specifically:

which is repealed in it's entirety. The repeal of any ordinance by this ordinance shall not affect or prevent any proceedings against or the prosecution or punishment of any person for any act done or committed in violation of any ordinance herein repealed prior to the effective date of this ordinance.
