The 2017 update to the Jamestown Comprehensive Plan was directly based on the various planning processes that the Town has conducted between 2013 and 2017 - particularly the Jamestown Area Long-Term Recovery Plan, the Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment, and the Land Use and Housing Study.
