Boulder County Zero Waste Grant

- Grant of \$1K-\$10K offered by Boulder County Resource Conservation Division for a project that focuses on resource diversion.
- JT has board approval to pursue grant for a large community "earth bin", or large compost. Benefits:
 - 1) <u>Safe for bears</u> Decreases bear-tampering in JT trash.
 - 2) <u>Cut trash bill by 25%</u> Cut down up to 25% of everyone's trash bill.
 - 3) Revegetate our land! Use the compost to revitalize our flood-stripped dirt with some badly needed humus.
- Earth Bin cost: \$10K Grant Proposal is due November 3rd.
- Will require community involvement. If you're interested, please talk to Erika!

Water System Updates

Water Distribution System Updates

- WTP creek crossing complete
- Lower Main Bridge creek crossing in progress
- Next will be the Little James Creek crossing
- Upper Ward St distribution system lines will begin next week with blasting (look for a communication this week with details)

Water Treatment Plant Repairs

- Infiltration gallery is complete
- Permanent intake is in progress
- Roughing filter
- Well house







Water System Updates

Boil Water Advisory and Water Bills

- The distribution system repairs are scheduled to be complete by 10/17
- The Town will begin the process to lift the Boil Water Advisory
- The Boil Water Advisory is expected to be lifted by 10/31!
- The Town will resume billing for water on 11/1
- **Important**: this may impact your any rental assistance you are receiving due to the Town's drinking water system.





Roads & Bridges Updates

Permanent Road Repairs

- Lower Main St is in progress
- Ward St will be completed after the distribution system lines are complete
- All work is scheduled to be complete by 10/24

Speed Limits in Town

- 15 mph for all vehicles
- We've requested haulers to do 5 mph








General Plan

- WALL B2 AND WALL B3 UPPER CONCRETE PANEL MSE WALLS






Wall A

Length = 113 feet






Wall A

Length = 113 feet






Wall B1

Length = 122 feet



Length = 122 feet








MSE Walls

- Wall B3 (Upper Wall) 62 feet long 4 feet High Above Ground








MSE Wall – Concrete Panels






MSE Wall – Landscaping For Tiered Planting Area
